In 2017, to celebrate the centenary of the Music Section of the Biblioteca de Catalunya (BC), it was organized the first edition of the seminar called *Pedrellianes* (in honour of the musicologist Felip Pedrell). Last three years, we have proposed and discussed with the agents involved in creating, teaching, researching, criticism and publishing musical heritage, about matters of common interest.

In 2020, some of the BC forecast activities has been rethinking due to the pandemic of COVID-19. As a result, this year, the *Pedrellianes*—with a different format— will be dedicated to the recovery of prominent names of the music in Catalonia, in particular to the composer Robert Gerhard, in the Gerhard Year, that begins in 2020—50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of his death— and will finish in 2021, commemorating the 125<sup>th</sup> anniversary of his birth.

Born in Valls in 1896, Robert Gerhard i Ottenwaelder studied with Enric Granados, and was pupil of Felip Pedrell and Arnold Schönberg.

Between 1934 and 1939 he was librarian of the Music Section of the Biblioteca de Catalunya, where he left an appreciable mark (publications, bibliography, the Festival of the International Society of Contemporary Music...). In 1939, to avoid possible reprisals, he remained in Paris until he went into exile to Cambridge, where he died in 1970.

Although the seminar is basically dedicated to Gerhard, to continue with the essence of the *Pedrellianes*, the seminar will include a final round table focused on actions and projects in Catalonia for recovering our musicians.
